### Mayor's Message

The 15 Cities that make up Fulton County and the Fulton County Commissioners are still negotiating the distribution of the Local Option Sales Tax (LOST), which is approximately \$3 billion tax dollars, distributed to the Cities over the next 10 years. Fulton County has not shown any willingness to discuss this in a public setting so the citizens of the County can hear their arguments for wanting more than the 4.98% they have been

receiving. Anything over this amount could mean a reduction in services and/or a property tax increase for all Fulton County citizens. The next date for mediation is October 7<sup>th</sup>. Please call or email your District 2 County Commissioner, Bob Ellis, and let him know that you want to understand why they need the increase and how they plan to spend this additional money that they are demanding. ## MOUNTAIN PARK GARDEN NEEDS LEAVES

Do you need somewhere to get rid of all those leaves in your yard? Once again, this year, the Mountain Park Community Garden will accept your yard leaves. The Garden is at the corner of Spruce St and Mountain Park Rd heading towards Cherokee County. You can lean the bags against our Gate to Nowhere (you'll see). If you want to empty your bags and reuse them, you can drop the leaves into the enclosure. Leaves and pine straw only please (no branches, ivy, etc.). This will continue through the winter.

As a reminder we cannot take your grass cuttings unless you can assure us that you use no chemicals on your grass.



# Know Your City Code

Sec. 113-42. General prohibition.

It shall be unlawful for any person to make, continue or cause to be made or continued any loud, unnecessary or unusual noise or any noise that unreasonably or unnecessarily annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others in the city.

#### Sec. 113-45. Enumeration.

The acts contained in this article, among others, shall constitute a violation of this article; but such enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive.

- (1) *Air conditioners.* The maintenance of any refrigeration machinery or air conditioning, consisting of air compressors or rotating or reciprocating machinery, in such a manner as to create a noise disturbance across a residential real property boundary shall be a violation of this article.
- (2) Construction or repairing of buildings. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or permit the operation of any tools or equipment used in construction, drilling, or demolition work on weekdays between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., such that the sound therefrom creates a noise disturbance across a residential real property boundary, except for emergency work of public service utilities or by special variance. No home construction shall be allowed on Saturday or Sunday except for construction between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.
- (3) Domestic animals. It shall be unlawful for any person owning or keeping an animal to allow that animal to continuously (exceeding 15 minutes in duration, or greater than five minutes between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 10:00 a.m.) or repeatedly (consisting of 15 minutes over the course of one hour) howl, bark, whine or make other loud noises plainly audible from inside any adjacent or nearby residential structure owned by any person other than the animal owner.
- (4) Domestic power tools. It shall be a violation of this article to operate or permit the operation of any mechanically powered saw, drill, sander, grinder, lawn or garden tool, lawnmower, or other similar device used outdoors, other than powered snow removal equipment, between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., or on Saturday or Sunday before the hour of 9:00 a.m.
- (5) *Explosives, firearms, or similar devices.* It shall be unlawful for any person to use or fire any explosives, firearms, or similar devices which create impulsive sound so as to cause a noise disturbance across a real property boundary or on a public space or right-of-way, without first obtaining a special variance.
- (6) Loudspeakers; amplifiers. It shall be unlawful for any person to use, operate, or permit the operation of any loudspeaker, public address system, mobile sound vehicle or similar device amplifying sound therefrom on a public right-of-way or public space for any commercial purpose. Further, it shall be unlawful to use, operate, or permit for any noncommercial purposes any loudspeaker, public address system, mobile sound vehicle, or similar device between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. on weekdays and between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. on weekends.
- (7) *Radios phonographs, musical instruments and similar devices.* It shall be unlawful for any person to operate, play, or permit the operation or playing of any radio, television, phonograph, drum, musical instrument, or similar device:
  - a. Between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. on weekdays and between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. on weekends in such a manner as to create a noise disturbance across a residential real property boundary, except as allowed by permit issued by the mayor and city council; or
  - b. In such a manner as to create a continuing noise disturbance at 50 feet from such device, when operated in or on a motor vehicle on a public right-of-way or public space.



#### October 1<sup>st</sup>......Dumpster Day 7am-10am

- 1. Must provide proof of residence in the City of Mountain Park.
- 2. ONE TRUCKLOAD OR TRAILER LOAD PER RESIDENCE.
- 3. All yard debris must be cut into 3 feet sections or less.

Please note that this is a service provided by Waste Pro as a courtesy and the City of Mountain Park does not have any control over what time they arrive/depart or the rate which the dumpster fills and the amount it can hold. Please plan accordingly. Thank you!

Please ensure you put your can(s) out the night before after 6pm or by 7am on Wednesday and leave them at the curb until they are picked up. Please remove your can(s) from the curb by 8am on Thursday. No garbage will be taken that is left outside of the trash containers. No yard debris is allowed. If your trash pick-up is missed, please contact City Hall Thursday morning before 12pm by calling 770-993-4231 or emailing utilitybilling@mountainparkgov.com.


#### \*\*REMINDER\*\*
